The remainder of 2016 and 2017 is going to be exciting not only on a provincial level but also at club level. We have implemented a monthly Club competition in each discipline to make our shooters more competitive when it comes to provincial championships. These monthly club championships will make the winner of that month's competition achieve a place in the final Yearly Club Championship which will incorporate the traditional Christmas shoot where our members are encouraged to bring along their friends and families.

An incentive that was introduced at The Gauteng North Open by Johan Jonck Snr, and that I would like to request other Provinces to implement at their Open championships, is the betting that can be held during each shoot. <u>KWAZULU-NATAL PROVINCIAL REPORT</u> <u>OCTOBER 2015 – MAY 2016</u>



The province fielded a full team at the Chairman's Cup which included four new members. The team acquitted itself well and took home the Skeet Plate Trophy, proving that new members can put in some good scores. In the words of the captain: "I have shot 14 Chairman's Cup competitions and this year the team spirit was the best I have experienced."

Four KZN shooters attended the 3rd ICTSF World Championship at Valley Gun Club. Hector Wills is congratulated for receiving bronze in the veteran category. The Eston Clay Target Club (ECTC) x-mas shoot continuous to be popular and some 124 shooters braved the rain armed with umbrellas. The rain is attributed for the slight decline from 187 shooters in 2014.

As previously mentioned, KZNCTSA is now an affiliate member of KZN Hunting & Conservation Association (KZNHCA). Both associations worked together to hold a successful shotgun clinic in March 2016 at Riva Valley Club (RVC). Some 13 KZNHCA members attended and feedback was so positive that another one has been scheduled for later this year. Many thanks to the sponsors Kings and Natal Gun Company and the CTSASA!

KZN welcomes a new club member, the Impala Shooting Club (ISC). The club is situated in Durban and has a small and active shotgun section which sets sporting targets. The shotgun section has grown over the past years and some club members attended the above-mentioned shotgun clinic. The club members are thanked for assisting at the KZN Standards Open.

RVC hosted a successful KZN Standards Open in April 2016. This is the first time that the province has split the Standards and the English Sporting Championships and a record 52 shooters from all provinces (except NC) attended. This is the 4th highest provincial and 3rd highest club entry in the last 13 years – and that without the sporting shooters. RVC and its landlord must be commended for their sterling effort in running a superb shoot. Shooters' feedback was very positive and it shows that smaller clubs in smaller provinces can "hold their ground" when compared to the bigger clubs in other provinces; KZNCTSA is proud to have a club of this calibre in the province! KZN shooters took home four team medals (skeet: gold; trench: silver; trap and DTL: bronze) and 15 individual medals in the various disciplines and classes.

The KZN Sporting Doubles Open was hosted by ECTC shortly after the Standard Open and 24 shooters, including five from different provinces and some nine weekend members, attended. It is encouraging to see clubs using the weekend membership to encourage their members to give a CTSASA competition a try.

The province has initiated the awarding of 'Certificates of Appreciation" which are presented to individuals for his/her efforts and dedication in promoting the sport of clay target shooting in this province. Recent recipients were Richard Manning, Hector Wills, Rob Ross, Norman Ellis, Dave de Winnaar and Raoul Fontana.
